The Birth: From Utah Ranch to Las Vegas

In 1928, a small group of livestock veterinarians regularly gathered around the wooden fence on a Logan, Utah ranch to trade knowledge on animal patient care. With that, the Intermountain Livestock Sanitary Association was born. As this brain trust continued to educate each other on best practices from an animal health perspective, they unwittingly created one of the largest veterinary education conferences in the world. They called it "Western Veterinary Conference" and through word-of-mouth and early marketing methods, the conference continued to grow year-after-year and eventually moved to the world-famous Las Vegas Strip.

The Journey of Growth: More Than a Conference

Over time, the Western Veterinary Conference continued to expand its reach while its name was shaved down to WVC. As WVC grew in participant numbers and educational offerings, the nonprofit organization welcomed opportunities to offer veterinary continuing education year-round, as well as incorporate human health bioskills training under its roof. This move created the largest freestanding combined animal and human hands-on training and continuing education organization on Earth.

The Breakthrough: Innovation Drives Growth

With the state-of-the-art technology, space and bioskills training, it was time to recognize the human health medical training element, and the organization became Viticus Group Education Centers. This intersection of animal and human healthcare hands-on training is where "life" meets "medicine" and encompasses the core of what we do, seven days a week.

Global Impact and Success

By 2024, Viticus Group Education Centers had welcomed participants from all seven continents since its inception. What started as a group of vets around a fence post became a respected leader in becoming a force in hands-on training and leading the way for future growth.

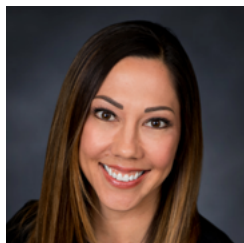

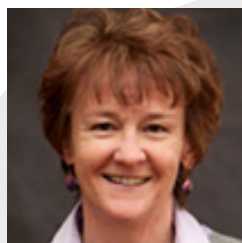

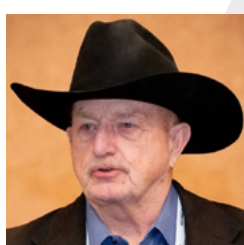

At the 2024 WVC Annual Conference, several innovative activations, games and experiential learning opportunities were introduced to engage attendees while enhancing their educational experience. Keep Your Gard Up: The Quest is On! gamified educational sessions, transformed learning into a competitive challenge as participants hunted for glass-blown ticks throughout the conference tied to key veterinary topics, created by local glassblowing artist, Greg LeFrancis, at LeFrancis Studios. This interactive approach heightened attendee engagement while reinforcing critical knowledge about parasitology and treatment modalities.

Additionally, Viticus Group was proud to introduce a first-of-its-kind, competitive card game

workshop called "This Clinic's on Fire", focused on practice management, employee relations, and clinic operations. Through fun and strategic gameplay, veterinary professionals honed essential skills for running a successful clinic and dealing with varied employee issues they commonly encounter.

Through the hands and eyes of art, participants learned to draw parasites while enriching their understanding of parasitology. Participants explored hematology by blending art with science. Taking education a step further, a unique session taught participants about parasitology products as they received custom-made red blood cells depicting Heinz bodies, symbolizing the parasitic infection Babesia, offering a memorable learning

Another session offered a deeply meaningful learning experience for participants as they crafted clay memorial items, providing both a new revenue stream for clinics and insights on sensitive client communication around end-of-life care.

Viticus Group provided new learning spaces in its 2024 WVC Annual Conference Exhibit Hall through three new custom-built learning lounges, each offering a unique and immersive educational experience. These lounges were designed so participants could better retain information due to the themed and memorable environments. The first lounge was styled as a vintage pharmacy, transporting attendees to a bygone era of medicine while they explored modern medical topics in a nostalgic setting. The second, a 1950's diner called "The Joint," created a relaxed and engaging atmosphere for learning. Lastly, the Western Frontier saloon provided a rugged backdrop for discussion, tying WVC back to its western pioneering roots. These thematic settings not only enriched the educational content but also enhanced memory retention by creating context-rich learning experiences.

Recognizing that nearly 50 percent of healthcare professionals deal with mental wellness issues, a strong emphasis was placed on both physical and mental wellness through the introduction of the Zen Den, a dedicated area teaching stress relief techniques, and the Wellness Walking Challenge, which encouraged achieving at least 17,000 steps per day, at WVC.

By providing these uniquely curated experiences for WVC participants, their educational growth is evident, memorable and useful in their own practice.

Dr. Jack Walther Recent Graduate Boot Camp

Held at Viticus Group Education Centers in Las Vegas, the boot camp is an interactive, hands-on training course held annually for newer veterinarians who are zero to five years out of veterinary school. The scholarship covers registration fees, hotel accommodations, meals and

onsite transportation for each recipient; travel expenses to and from Las Vegas are not included.

This year's boot camp focused on providing small group lectures and hands-on instruction in anesthesia, dentistry and soft tissue surgery, with the goal of elevating their patient care by learning advanced methods that newer veterinarians can then immediately use in their practice.

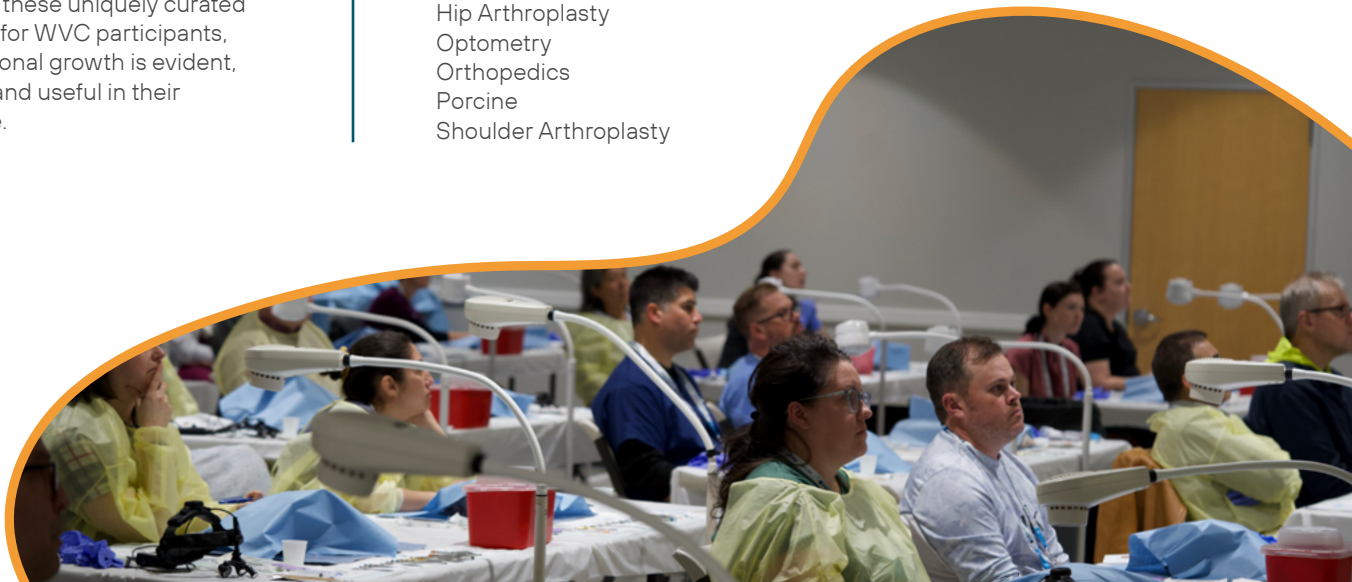

Human Health Highlights

In a first-ever event, Viticus Group hosted the International Spine Study Group (ISSG) in 2024. The organization, formed by President and Founder Dr. Shay Bess in 2009, focuses on groundbreaking research for the treatment of adult spine deformity. The event included hands-on cadaveric sessions with 15 torso-to-head specimens, supported by 13 device vendors, and was attended by 200 U.S. medical professionals. Due to the success of the 2024 event, Dr. Bess, a practicing spine surgeon, and ISSG are expected to return to Viticus Group in 2025, expanding its event to an international audience and more than 300 participants. We are proud to partner with ISSG, which plays a vital role in shaping the future of innovative spine research.
